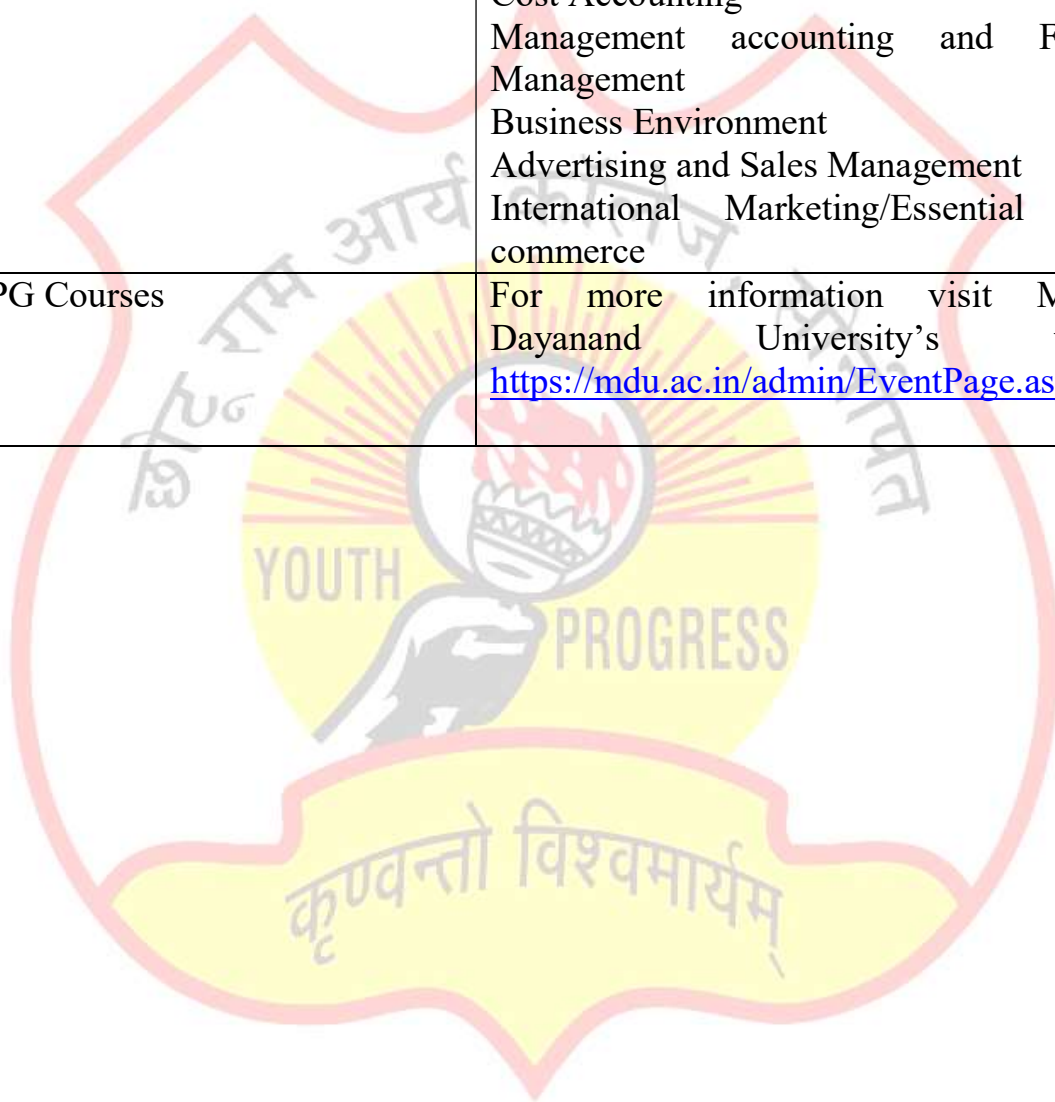

I have been directed to inform you that the process of centralized Online Admission for Undergraduate Classes for the session 2023-24 in all Government, Aided and Self-Financing Colleges of Haryana will commence from 29th May, 2023. 2. Non-refunding Registration Fee of Rs. 100 shall be charged from all the applicants during session 2023-24.
3. Late fee will be charged from the applicants admitted through Open Counselling and is as follow: -

Late Fee (1 st week during Open Counselling)	Rs. 100/-
From 2 nd Week onwards during Open Counselling	Rs. 100/- Additional Rs. 100/- Per Day

4. Registration Fee and Late Fee shall remain with the State Government and all changes will submit the same to the HQ.
5. Fee/Fund Structure for admission to various courses shall be as per State Govt/University norms.
6. **Principals of the Colleges must ensure to add those Courses & Subjects on the online admission portal which have been approved by State Government/University. The seats in various courses/subjects must be entered as sanctioned by the competent authority. Any negligence in the matter will lead to disciplinary action against the Principal.**
7. No change will be allowed after freezing the subject combination seats, so the colleges are advised to fill the combination seats as per their requirement keeping in view the previous year's admission trends.
8. Also, Colleges shall ensure the inclusion of Sports seats while filling the Seats of a course, if applicable. The Process of filling Sports Seats, if applicable, shall be ensured by the Colleges only during open counselling as per affiliating University/State Government norms.
9. Registration on Online Admission Portal is mandatory for admission seekers/applicants. **Applicants are advised to fill the online application form very carefully. No editing shall be allowed after Final Submission of application form.** PPP shall remain mandatory for Haryana applicants for taking admission in Degree Colleges. In case of Courses having multiple subject combinations in one college/different colleges at the time of filling the admission form.
10. Weightage criteria for preparing the merit list during session 2023-24 shall also stand same as was in the session 2022-23 in addition to NSS Merit Certificate Weightage vide this office letter No. 15/1-2020 NSS(2) dated 10.05.2023.
11. The State Reservation Policy shall be followed in letter and spirit.
12. Merit lists for session 2023-24 shall be prepared after considering marks of best five subjects in the qualifying examination, weightage and State

Reservation Policy. In addition to that, provision of 'Defer' the allotted seat by the applicant in the 1st Merit List for reconsideration in 2nd Merit List will be provided to the applicant, subject to the condition that applicant could not get this first choice in the 1st Merit List.

13. Online Documents Verification shall be carried out by the college opted as first choice by the applicant. All colleges including Govt. Colleges, Govt. Aided Colleges and Self-Financing Colleges shall be included during the process of Online Documents Verification.
14. The mode of fee collection from students/applicants will be Online for all colleges during entire admission process, whereas offline mode will be provided during the open/physical counselling for Aided/SF Colleges. The clarification regarding fee structure is as follows: -
 - a) Tuition Fee of all Girl Students is Zero.
 - b) Tuition Fee of all SC Students of Haryana in Govt. Colleges is Zero.
 - c) Total amount of Fee and Funds to be charged from the SC students of Haryana in Aided/SFS Colleges/Courses initially at the time of admission is Zero subject to the condition that the SC students fulfil the eligibility of Post Matric Scholarship Scheme (i.e., Family Income should be less than 2.5 Lacs for preceding financial year).
 - d) Migration/Eligibility Fee, if applicable, is to be charged only from the students of other than Haryana Board, subject to the norms of affiliating university.
In Aided and SF Colleges, students will have the option of payment of fees semester wise in two installments. However, in Government Colleges, students will have to pay annual fee in single installment.
15. The applicant whose admission is confirmed shall submit his/her original migration certificate in the college within ten days of admission, if he/she has passed the qualifying examination from any Board other than Board of School Education Haryana.

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College Activities

Sports

Vehicle Stand

There is facility of vehicle stand near the main gate of the college. Only those students who have paid the fee for cycle/scooter to the college will be allowed to place their cycle/scooter at the stand. All students should keep their vehicle at the stand.

Notice Board

All important notices concerning the students and the college activities are put up on the notice board. Notices concerning the activities of the various departments are put on the departmental as well as general notice board. The students are required to read the notices every day. Information regarding college tour, college magazine, examination, vacations, will be put on the notice board. Ignorance of rule in no excuse.

College Magazine

Honours and Felicitation:

Cash Prize and Certificate of Merit

Our students distinguish themselves in various fields every year and bring honour to the college. There are three Categories viz. Academic, Sports, Cultural activities.

Academic: Prizes, Certificates of Merit are awarded on the basis of last Annual Examinations. These prizes are also awarded on the basis of marks obtained in the House Examinations. Candidates getting 1st, 2nd and 3rd positions in aggregate and 1st position in individual subject shall deserve these prizes.

Sports and Cultural: Students showing special talent in studies, sports, co-curricular activities, social work and any work of goodness will be awarded special prizes and certificates of merit.

Educational Tours:

The college organizes education tours in its pursuit of excellence in all field and in life itself. Generally, these tours are planned on Saturdays and Sundays. The concession for such tours is granted as per college rules.

Women Cell

To make the women understand her rights and duties along with time management and also to manage herself, women cell has been formed in the college. The Women Cell of the college organizes different activities and awareness programmes throughout the year. **Dr. (Mrs.) Usha Dahiya** is the incharge of women cell.

General Conditions:

Examination Rules

Continuous Absence: As per university rules, if a student remains absent from his/her class for seven consecutive days without valid reason, medical or otherwise, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls irrespective of the fact that he/she has paid his/her dues.

Fee Non-Refundable: College fee and other charges once paid will not be refunded in any case.

Leave Rules

1. A student shall apply for leave to the Principal Chhotu Ram Arya College, when needed.
2. The student is required to submit his/her application before availing himself/herself of leave and not after absenting from the college. In case of illness, application must be submitted on the day when the student attends the college after recovery.
3. Leave for three days will be sanctioned by the concerned tutor and leave up to seven days will be sanctioned by the principal. Application by post shall not be accepted.
4. A medical certificate from registered Medical Practitioner must accompany the application for sick leave.

Eligibility for annual examination

1. Only those students will be permitted to appear in the University Examinations who fulfil the conditions specified under special regulations.
2. A Students shall not be eligible to appear in the University Examinations unless he/she has attended at least 75% of the full course of lectures delivery in each subject both in theory and practical separately in each semester.

Internal assessment U.G. and P.G. Classes

Internal Assessment system of 10% marks (5% on the basis of House Examination and 5% on the basis of attendance) in U.G. Classes has been introduced w.e.f. the session 2004-2005 and of 20% in P.G. classes w.e.f. the session 2007-2008. The weightage of internal assessment will be as under:

Attendance	Marks
Below 75%	0
76% - 80%	4
Above 80%	5

The internal assessment is allowed in theory papers only.

Attendance

The semester examination shall be open to a regular student who:

1. Bears good character
2. He has attended not less than 65% of the classes and 75% of practical.

General Rules Governing Students Conduct

1. Ragging is strictly prohibited. Any violation of this rule may lead to expulsion from the college besides fine.
2. Mobiles are not allowed inside the college building. Any students found with mobile shall be fined Rs. 100/- and Mobile shall be confiscated.
3. Smoking and playing on cards on the college campus are not allowed. Students violating this rule shall be severely punished.
4. Classes will be held according to the declared Time-Table. The principal is authorized to make changes in it as per requirement anytime. Students commuting by trains or buses should bear in mind that the college Time-Table need to be attuned to Railway or Bus Timings.
5. Walking or talking in corridors during class-time will invite punishment.
6. Proxy at the time of Roll-Call is an offence and in punishable.
7. The students must reach their respective class rooms as soon as the bell sounds. After Teacher has closed the register, students will not be marked present.
8. Calling any student from class with getting permission of the teacher are liable to fined heavily.
9. Students leaving the class rooms without the permission of the teacher are liable to be fined heavily.
10. It is the duty of the student to get information of his/her attendance at the end of a session.

No complaint will be entertained at the end of the year in this regard. In case of doubt regarding calculation of attendance the student should immediately approach the concerned teacher.

11. Every Student must carry his Identity Card & Wear Badge throughout his stay in the college. It can be checked by any teacher at any time. In the event of an Identity Card getting lost, a student can get duplicate can get duplicate ID Card/Badge on making a payment of Rs. 50/-.
12. Damaging college property is an offence. Writing anything on the walls not entail any responsibility for the stand contractor.
13. Dustbins should be used for disposing off any waste matter.
14. Parking cycle or scooter without lock at the Cycle stand will not entail any responsibility for the stand contractor.
15. It is a must for students to attend functions organized on the college campus.
16. All the students of the college are supposed to be governed by college discipline.
17. Bringing mischievous and rowdy persons from outside the college is an offence.
18. In case of change in address as mentioned in the Admission Form, the Principal should be informed immediately with valid proof of such change.
19. The students using unfair means in an examination shall be punished by the Unfair Means Committee.

Welfare Schemes

Scholarships/Stipends

The college offers a number of scholarship/stipends under the following schemes. The eligible students should submit their applications on the prescribed form complete in all respect to the Principal by August 31, 2012 positively.

1. Government of India Post Metric Scholarship scheme for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Students. Under this scheme the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes students whose parent's total income from all sources does not exceed Rs. 65,290/- per annum, for full scholarship and Rs. 1,00,000 for half scholarship are eligible for the scholarship. All the children of the same parents will be entitled to receive benefit of the scheme. The heads of institutions are competent to sanctioned these scholarships.
2. State *Harijan* Welfare scheme for backward class students: The students belonging to recognized backward classes and the total income of whose parents does not exceed Rs. 24,000/- (Rs. 65,290/- proposed by the Govt.) per annum are eligible for stipends under this scheme as per existing Haryana Govt. Rules.

3. Govt. of India Scheme of Matric Scholarship to lower income group students of denotified Nomadic and Semi-Nomadic tribes.

Various scholarships are available under the scheme for award to the eligible students in general category on the basis of total annual income of their parents.

4. Government of India National Loan scholarship scheme:

The students who are not eligible to secure scholarship under above mentioned scheme can seek loans under this scheme if they secure at least 60% marks in the qualifying examination. The annual basic pay of their parents should not exceed 25,000/- (after deducting relatable items allowed under the income tax law). There is, however, no income condition or 60% marks in renewal class.

- a) Government of India National Scholarship Scheme.
- b) Government of India National Merit scheme for the children of the school teachers.
- c) Haryana State Government (Education Department) Merit scholarship in college for general University Education.
- d) One time scholarship for those candidates who have secured above 60% marks in 10+2 examination form Haryana Board of School Education, Bhiwani.

- 2) **Concessional Seasonal Ticket:**

Bus and train concessional pass facility is available for all the students.

- 3) **Fee Concession:**

Fee concession to the deserved students on the basis of Academics, Sports, Cultural activities and other criteria are given as per the norms laid down from time to time. For further information contact the concerned committee.

- 4) **Mentor-mentee Meeting:**

This cell is created to address the problems of the students.

- 5) **Anti-ragging Cell:**

This cell is created for the freshers who feel being victimized.

- 6) **Sexual Harassment Cell:**

To address the problems related to sexual harassment

- 7) **Equal Opportunity Cell:**

This cell safeguards the interest of students irrespective of caste, class and gender.

Note:

1. The reservation of seats as per reservation policy of Haryana Government and is subject to any change amendment by the State Government from time to time.
2. Where a seat set aside for candidate from Deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government Educational Institutions is not filled up in academic year due to non-availability of candidate of Deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualifications, the same shall be made available to candidate of Scheduled Castes. Reserved seats will not be carried forward to next year.
3. Remaining instructions for reservation shall remain the same as already notified by the State Government from time to time.

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
